The Humanity of Handmade: Ethel Mairet, Coomaraswamy and Gandhi

British born Ethel Mairet was a pioneer of weaving in the early twentieth century. She travelled to Ceylon (now Sri Lanka) with her husband, the celebrated Indian art historian and philosopher, Ananda Coomaraswamy, documenting the arts and crafts of the villages and publishing their observations on her return to England. Her documentation of traditional methods of weaving, dyeing and embroidery was noted by Mahatma Gandhi, who visited Mairet in 1914.

ARTISANS' Founder and Director, Radhi Parekh, will talk about Ethel Mariet's fascinating life and her continuing influence on the craft traditions of the Indian sub-continent. Radhi's research into Mairet's work has formed part of a major exhibition currently showing at the Museum of Barnstaple and North Devon, UK, where Ethel Mairet was born.

WHERE MONUMENTS SING ...

Birwa Qureshi talks about her journey with Crraft Of Art an initiative focused on reintroducing monuments to the people, especially the younger generation.

The special effort is in unearthing the monument's hidden art, history and glory, presenting it to people in a form that makes it richer in content and appeal and blending it with music that makes the message special and relevant.

Crraft of Art is the brain child of Birwa an Interior Designer and Bharat Natyam Dancer from Darpana Academy of Performing Arts under Guru Smt. Mrinalini Sarabhai and her husband Fazal Qureshi Tabla Maestro, son of legendary Ustad Allarakha.

For the past 13 years, in 27 Music Festivals, Crraft of Art has taken the monuments to people, so to speak, through a rich blend of quality thematic music and display of the monument's innate craftsmanship, beauty and splendor. Some of the historical sites for these festivals are Rani ki Vav (Patan), Lakshmi Vilas Palace (Baroda), Ellora Caves (Aurangabad).

Done in public interest, the festivals have opened a new direction in not only making people proud of their heritage but building a new consciousness in ways that they are preserved and conserved.

Charbya or food that is chewed like Rice and Fish.


