# A MORNING WITH HEMANT CHATURVEDI

**Hemant Chaturvedi** spent over 30 years working as a cinematographer in Mumbai, before moving away from the profession in 2015. His cinematography credits include films like Company, Makdee, Maqbool, 15 Park Avenue, Ishaqzaade, Kurbaan, Brothers, and even an animated film called Arjun the Warrior Prince.

He returned to full time still photography and now only works on his own projects. These range from Dhrupad Gurukuls to the documentation of the sesquicentennial of his Alma Mater, St.Xavier's College, Mumbai. He has also documented old British era cemeteries, Zoroastrian Aram Grahs, abandoned Hindu idols and India's single screen cinema heritage,

The Single Screen Cinemas Project is the largest photodocumentation ever attempted on a subject like this, anywhere in the world. Hemant drove around 40,000 km alone in his jeep, visiting 17 states and over 800 towns. He photographed over 1000 single screen cinema theatres.

#### A WALK THROUGH MUMBAI'S ICONIC FILM AND MUSIC HISTORY

A unique experience awaits us as we embark on a specially curated guided walk today. We begin at the Jehangir Art Gallery and go through Kala Ghoda, past the Prince of Wales Museum and Regal Cinema onto the waterfront, past the Gateway of India and conclude at the Radio Club. Mumbai is known as India's movie capital, and the focus will be on the city's film and music history and its connection to these areas.

Our guide today is **Manek Premchand**, a writer and historian of film music, who teaches broadcasting at St. Xavier's College's Xavier Institute of Communications. Manek has led many groups of students and historians in exploring Mumbai's deep connections with the arts. In July 2022, he conducted a field trip identifying where the first cinema was shown in India, and also from where the first radio signals were sent. Manek regularly writes for publications such as the *Hindustan Times, Deccan Herald, Mumbai Mirror* and *DNA*. He has also written numerous books, including *Yesterday's Melodies - Today's Memories, Musical Moments from Hindi Films, Romancing the Song, Hitting the Right Notes* and several more.

# THE COVENANT OF WATER – BY ABRAHAM VERGHESE
