


Avalon Waterways, Leo Travel, the cruisers, and the Travel Committee will soon meet for an information exchange session as we look forward to a wonderful trip!


Staying true to our spirit of intercultural Indus activities, "Bavarian Oktoberfest" is our theme for this year's fellowship on **Friday, 20th September**.

KASHISH Pride Film Festival Director **Sridhar Rangayan** wears many hats: filmmaker, activist, and festival curator. He has given a voice to the Indian LGBTQ+ community through his writings, public speaking, and films. His award-winning films ("Evening Shadows", "Breaking Free", "Gulabi Aaina", "68 Pages") have screened at over 300+ festivals and won 35+ awards. He, along with his partner **Saagar Gupta** (Director of Programming), were petitioners for same-sex marriage rights and together they organize the KASHISH Pride Film Festival, which over the past 15 years has been hailed as South Asia's biggest LGBTQ+ film festival.

They have been awarded the 6 SIGMA accreditation for this accomplishment, have been the subject of a case study on Operation Management at IIM and Harvard and were included in Prince Charles' itinerary on his visit to India. And all this has been achieved with literacy rate of 1 out of 16! They are the true icons of Mumbai!!

Today, **Subhash Talekar**, President, Mumbai Dabbawala Association, will take us through the astonishing story of their organization. Apart from their main business, he will tell us about the charities run by them, chief among them being the Roti Bank – where they collect excess food from restaurants, hotels and residences from all over Mumbai to deliver it and feed the needy and hungry. Thus, they provide a vital link between the haves and have nots of the city. The logistics of collection, distribution, transport for a timely pick up of the perishables is awe-inspiring and entirely funded and managed by them.
