Roy has received the National Award for Excellence and Best Director for the film Shahjahanabad: The Twilight Years. He has lectured and worked with Universities including Western Australia, Durban, Brisbane, Monash, University of Chicago, Harvard, MIT Media lab, Admas, Symbiosis, University of Houston, Columbia College, London School of Economics, University of York, Swansea, etc.

The island had its own fort, dock, churches, gunpowder factory and even a Hanging Garden long before the one in Malabar Hill was built.
