Travel

This year, we have two exciting options to choose from for our 6 -7 day domestic trip in November. The tentative date for departure is 18th November 2023. To help you decide where you would like to go, here is a synopsis of the alternatives.

OPTION 1

ALLAHABAD, AYODHYA & LUCKNOW

Allahabad, Ayodhya and Lucknow are in the most populous and multicultural state of India – Uttar Pradesh.

Allahabad, now Prayagraj. Prayag or Triveni Sangam is the confluence of rivers Ganga, Yamuna and the mythical Saraswati. This site is also one of the four cities that host the Kumbh Mela, the historic Hindu festival and pilgrimage, every 12 years. On the very same river banks is also a massive fort built by Emperor Akbar in 1583 AD. More recently, it has been labelled the City of Prime Ministers, as seven Indian PMs have connections to Allahabad.

Ayodhya, an ancient city of India, also known as Saket, is situated on the banks of the Holy River Saryu. It is regarded as one of the Sapta Puris – seven sacred cities of Hindus – and revered because of its association with the great Indian epic Ramayana. It is believed to be the Janmabhoomi or birthplace of Lord Rama. This 'city built by Gods' was invaded by the Mughals and influenced by other cultures, over centuries. So, not surprisingly, it is dotted with ancient Hindu temples, ruins of Babur's mosque and Jain shrines.

Lucknow, a bustling city, is known for its courtly manners, beautiful gardens, poetry, music and fine cuisine. Once known as Shiraz-i-Hind (Golden City of the East) or the Constantinople of India, it has a rich history and culture. The Rumi Darwaza, the Bara Imambara, the Bhool Bhulaiya and the grand Victorian Husainabad Clock Tower are among the spectacular architectural sights dotting the city. This City of Nawabs is definitely worth visiting for its unique tangible and intangible culture, Chikankari embroidery and kebabs!

OPTION 2

MANDU-MAHESHWAR-UJJAIN

All three of these cities are in the heart of India – in Madhya Pradesh.

Mandu, an epitome of architectural excellence, boasts of the oldest erected monument of our country. With its beautiful palaces, monuments and widespread lawns, it tells stories of unconditional love between Prince Baz Bahadur and Rani Roopmati. The imposing Jahaz Mahal Palace, beautiful Hindola Mahal, ancient Jama Masjid and sprawling Roopmati Pavilion are all remnants of this ancient city.

Maheshwar, now famous for its gorgeous ghats and beautiful sarees, was once the capital of Rajmata Ahilya Devi Holkar's state. Artistic temples like Raj Rajeshwar and Tilbhandeshwar temples and other monuments talk to us about the legends of Adiguru Shankaracharya and Pandit Mandan Mishra. Located on the banks of the river Narmada, this glorious ancient city is mentioned in the epics Mahabharata and Ramayana.

Ujjain, an important pilgrimage city for Hindus, is on the banks of the river Kshipra and is one of the four cities that hosts the Kumbh Mela. It has one of the 12 Jyotirlings of Shiva and is believed to have the footprints of God Vishnu. No wonder then that it is called the City of Temples.

So here you have it - so much to do and see in our beautiful, historical country! Make a well informed choice and do let us know by 15th July 2023.
